President's Message



Welcome to summer and some positive changes. I am so happy to announce that we will be having an in-person convention this fall. Board Action



On June 12, 2021, the WSO Board held our meeting via Zoom.

President Anji Grainger called the meeting to order at 12:04 pm. Twelve Board members and seven committee members were present.

The Board approved **Secretary Amanda James'** minutes from the April 2021 meeting.

Past President Barb Sulek is currently working on filling the following positions:

Vice President, Administrative Director, Registration Chair, *Watermark* Advertising Chair, and a new Hospitality Team. Nominations for the Outstanding Service Award will be sent out, and the presentation will take place at the Fall Convention.

As **Registration Chair, Barb Sulek** also reported on the registration for the new pre-recorded Breakout Sessions. Of note was the great response to the pre-recorded breakout sessions, which totaled 453 purchases. Survey emails will be sent to both members who signed up for the sessions and those who did not.

Treasurer Nancy Fraser reported on the Financial Statements for the period ending May 31, 2021. She asked the Board to consider continuing the virtual sessions. These are very attractive for members who cannot attend the conventions. We sold \$4,530 worth of sessions and have all the equipment needed to film these programs. The Spring Convention had a net income of \$1,497.60.

Vice President Winnie Givot reported on the likelihood that Jian Wu and Janine Gallizia will be the jurors for the 2024 shows.

Merit Award Chair Becky Meier reported that three more members achieved Signature Status, and seven members have reached higher Merit Award Status.

WSO 100 Club President Suzy Carroll announced that the club would send a fundraising mailer with perks to all WSO members this summer.

Education Director Linda Nye reported that **Kathy Rock** will be assuming the position of Education Director and that Linda will continue working with her. Kathy and Linda requested that any members with experience in grant writing or the desire to learn how to write grant requests join them in forming a grant writing team. The Linda Rothchild Ollis bequest is designated for technical needs and the Board was asked for suggestions on where to use the funds.


Awards Director Beth Verheyden introduced four Motions regarding the wording of specific provisions for our exhibitions. All of these passed unanimously.

Menucha Liaison Chris Stubbs reported on the success of Yong Hong Zhong's workshop. She told the Board that the participants raved about the food and the graciousness of the staff. **Chris Stubbs** will be working with Menucha in planning for an October workshop.

WFWS Delegate Chris Stubbs announced the awards presented to our members at the annual WFWS show, hosted by the Utah Watercolor Society. The WSO members receiving awards included Mila Raphael, who won 2nd place with a \$1,200 award; Sam Livingston 5th place and a \$600 award; and Steve Rothert, who received a 13th place award and \$225.

Convention Director Zsuzsa Vamos announced that the convention chairs are preparing for a live event at the Salem Convention Center and the Elsinore Gallery.

Sandy Wood, Becky Meier, and Zsuzsa Vamos will be convention chairs for the April 2022 Convention in Hillsboro. Preliminary reservations have been made with The Embassy Suites Hotel for the breakout sessions and the banquet. A request has been made with the Hillsboro Brookwood Library for exhibit space. The search for a workshop location continues. (continued on page 6)





As the new WSO Education Director, I will support the mission of WSO by creating, fostering, and sustaining artistic growth and interest in watermedia throughout Oregon. I will strengthen these goals by expanding the education opportunities and resources for WSO members and the state.

- **Regional critique groups** will be invigorated and expanded by conducting a needs assessment and establishing an education and mentoring program.

Individual award amounts will increase for Best of Show (\$600 to \$800), 2nd Place (\$525 to \$600) and the 14 Awards of Distinction (\$150 to \$200). Online Registration for 2021 Fall Convention Events

We will use electronic registration for all of our 2021 Fall Convention events. Each event will be individually priced, and you may select as many or as few of the items you wish.

You will be able to register for lain Stewart's in-person workshop on August 1, 2021. The workshop will be October 4 - 8, 2021, from 9:00 am - 4:00 pm, and held at the Kroc Center, 1865 Bill Frey Drive, Salem OR. A maximum of 25 people can register for the Juror's Workshop. A link to workshop registration will be in the email notifying you that your 2021 August *Watermark* is available, and also in the *Watermark*.

Beginning August 7, 2021, at 8:00 am, you will be able to register for all 2021 Fall Convention events (including the Meet & Greet, Breakout sessions, Reception, Awards Banquet, Juror Critiques and the Juror's Lecture/Demo) within the same registration site. Registration for Convention events will close on September 4, 2021, at 8:00 pm. After verifying your selections, payment by credit card may be made through PayPal (no PayPal account necessary), or you may opt to pay by check using the information provided on your confirmation sheet (which is emailed to you immediately after you register).

You will be sent an email with a link to register for the 2021 Fall Convention events one week prior to the opening of registration; a reminder email will be sent immediately before registration begins. Alternatively, you may go to the WSO website and select "Convention Registration" from the News & Events menu after Convention Registration opens to the public.

Please note: Per WSO policy, "Refunds are made only if a reservation is canceled within five (5) days after the close of online registration, or in the event of serious illness, accident, or death in the family." All refunds less a \$25.00 processing fee will be mailed or refunded via PayPal after the workshop, according to the original method of payment.

The refund deadline for the 2021 Fall Convention is on or before Friday, September 10, 2021.



Making Digital Art Easy with Elizabeth Zimmerman 9:00 am – 10:30 am Croisan – Room C

Elizabeth Zimmerman will start from ground zero to show us how to navigate an app for Apple iPads called Procreate. If you do not have the app or are trying to figure it out, Elizabeth will show you the steps for how to create your canvas, add layers, import images, choose colors, and fine tune your brush selections. There are many ways to create art in this digital age, and even if it's created digitally, you can still give it a traditional look.





Procreate can be a great tool for playing with colors, compositions, line work, and doodling. There have been times that bringing along an iPad and Apple Pencil is a better strategy for life drawing than packing around messy charcoals, cloth, eraser, chalk, and sketchpad. Watercolor has its own special quality which is difficult to duplicate with digital mediums. Digital art does not need to replicate your watercolor paintings; it can be just for fun and stand on its own.

Elizabeth has been playing around with digital art for her new small business Western Rose Co. (www.WesternRoseCo.com), where her illustrations are available as stickers, cards, prints, and shirts.

She will take you on a visual exploration of how art is an extension of nature no matter what form it takes.


You will see examples of Persian art, craft and architecture, and how even the food is enhanced with rich, jewel tone colors.

This class uses Saran Wrap in a different way than most people use it. The technique is particularly effective in portraying rock strata such as those found in the desert Southwest. We will focus on learning the technique rather than painting a picture.

- Your usual painting supplies
- Original Saran Wrap
- Quinacrodone Gold paint
- Dioxazine Purple paint or dark purple substitute
- a Any color of red paint
- 2 1/4 sheet of watercolor paper of your choice. 300# takes a long time to dry and you will not be able to use a hair dryer. I suggest using 140#, 156# or Crescent Watercolor Board #115.

Bring a sense of adventure to explore the edge just outside the box.

Bring a sense of play to the creative journey.

Be inspired as each layer, each mark, each surprise unfolds.

Be in awe as your head and heart and gut-felt intuition awaken and dance.

"My creative journey has always involved

responding to an essential ingredient of an experience and following the threads that flow to a magical finale. I trust the collaboration with an authentic source within and beyond myself. A huge curiosity about this journey has kept my enthusiasm at a fevered pitch for many years."

Using their own work that they have deemed unsuitable or unfinished, or just confusing as to what's next, participants will add layers of texture and color. They will eventually cut some of these pieces up and collage with them, creating a whole new and exciting creative expression.

In Iain Stewart's own words, "A truly great workshop will lead you to being surprised at what you are capable of and invigorated to explore further!" I hope you are getting excited about the upcoming convention and juror's workshop! We are so lucky to receive instruction at this world class level.

It has been a long time since we have been able to get together. So, let's gather, learn, and have fun. Our Juror for this October's Convention is Iain Stewart, an internationally recognized award-winning artist. In addition, he is an architectural illustrator with international clientele. But don't let this intimidate you beginners out there because...

What makes this workshop particularly exciting is that lain is not only an exceptional artist, he is a highly experienced art instructor. He teaches watercolor and design drawing at Auburn University's School of Architecture. He has workshops all over the United States and abroad, and online. In addition, he has recently released his latest book, "En Plein Air, Light and Color." His unique combination of skills will give you a clear step-by-step process based on design and focused on helping you find or clarify your own artistic voice.

The following was written by Jain Stewart:

Together we will cover all aspects of how I work to keep my paintings lively and gestural. It's quite easy to get bogged down in detail and for me the perfect tool is the sketchbook. We will work both in our books and on traditional watercolor paper covering a range of subject matter and scenes. I believe that a workshop without the worry of success typically leads you just there. Learn how to let go of the fear of ruining a painting and take true joy in your work.

I will share my process to begin drawing with confidence, painting quickly, and breaking a painting down into understandable steps that you can repeat on your own. I typically cover how to treat painting water scenes, landscapes, and the urban environment in all of my workshops. My interest in these subjects is how man's hand has touched the earth and how my sense of "place" is explored. I find this practice to be unique to everyone and it is my intention to help you find your own artistic voice.

We will cover design, drawing, painting techniques, and finally an understandable

way to put them all together. As an instructor I do not like to "pull rabbits out of hats." I want you to understand my motivation at every stage of the process so that you can decide how you may choose to incorporate some of my techniques in your own work.

I believe a good workshop begins with a foundation built on freedom from fear and the importance of pushing yourself to new levels of expression. A workshop should not be about the instructor stunning you with their own work. It is about your experience. A truly great workshop will lead to you being surprised at what you are capable of and invigorated to explore further. My very best,




