President's Message

As we move into 2023, I see a few challenges ahead for WSO. Our membership numbers have fallen after years of isolation from the COVID-19 pandemic, and we are also aging out. The good news is that we are a vibrant community of artists, banded together for connection, friendship, support, learning, and inspiration. We have the ability to address these issues, and overcoming them together could give us even greater strength and resilience.

This challenge is a wonderful opportunity for WSO and for each of you. This is *your* chance to be in on the grass roots level and to make a real difference for the organization we all love. Past President's Message



Collective Wisdom

Favorite Painting Tools

I realize it must have been overwhelming to contemplate choosing a few favorite tools from the long list of possibilities I offered you in the November *Watermark* (brushes, palette knives, sponges, texture makers, mark makers, paint or masking applicators, or other implements some of us may never have imagined). So I'm going to narrow down the

focus of my request for the May issue to just one category: **paint applicators (including brushes)**. Even within this category there are, of course, many options. We'll explore some of the other categories over time.

Luckily, the one response I received for the February *Watermark* issue from Liz Walker will serve as an excellent example to inspire your favorite choices of paint

applicators.

Needle Nose Paint Applicators

I'd like to share a useful tool that I keep close at hand in my studio—needle nose applicator bottles. There are two types, and they each serve a unique purpose.

The first is a set of 1 oz needle tip squeeze bottles (sold on Amazon in a package of six for about \$9). I fill them with diluted acrylic paints or inks (diluted watercolors work, too) and this fine tip allows me to create fine lines on my painting. If the tip gets clogged, I just stick a pin in it to open it up!

Falling in Art 1oz Needle Tip Squeeze Bottle (Link to this product on Amazon.)



The second type of applicator is a bit pricier (around \$10 for two 1 1/4 oz bottles) but well worth it. Made by Gaunt Industries, it can be purchased online and at Tap Plastics in Oregon. Its needle nose tip is so narrow that paint tends to clog, so I only use it for applying drops of rubbing alcohol to wet paint (acrylic or watercolor). The alcohol droplets form interesting white circles in the paint that create a fabulous pattern. Your painting must be WET with paint when you apply the drops of alcohol—otherwise not much happens.



Doreen loved forests, bays, tides, lakes and gardens and felt these special places needed to be painted. And paint them she did, as well as portraits, wildlife and pets. She was a lifelong accomplished artist, especially admired for her watercolors. She taught painting and was a member of the Watercolor Society of Oregon and a Signature member of Northwest Watercolor Society. She won many awards and honors for her paintings,

including a WSO Silver Merit Award. Doreen imparted her love of painting to her children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren.

As an outdoorswoman, she enjoyed fishing, camping, hiking and skiing. When first married, she and her husband Warren hiked around the perimeter of Mt Hood. Together, they also explored all the mountain lakes they could hike to. Sadly, Warren predeceased her in 2005. She taught her family a deep love of the outdoors. On a camping trip with granddaughter, Angela, they swam in the John Day River, and cooked an unfortunate road-killed quail by campfire. She was an adventurer! Doreen loved her dogs and outlived many of them.

She is survived by her children Steve, Susan and Caroline, three grandchildren and five great-grandchildren whom she loved

and who made her very proud. She leaves many good friends behind, and there were some that went before her, including fellow artist, Richard "Dick" Haward, who was a close and special friend.

She had a long and rich life, and will be missed, and remembered with great affection.



In Memoriam ILynn Peterson



JLynn Peterson was a well-known artist in the Roseburg community and one of my closest friends. She spent many hours with me in her studio teaching me to respect her knowledge of the printing press. Printer's ink was her favorite medium; a medium she used to complete many large, personal portraits in block print.

When JLynn first moved to the Roseburg area, she met the local watercolor artists by joining the Umpqua Valley Watercolor Society and painting en plein air with other artists every summer. I met her at that first plein air meeting where she was an instant inspiration because of her enthusiasm and all-around knowledge.

JLynn graduated cum laude with a B.A. in art from Weber State University in Ogden, Utah, in 1961. She was also an adjunct faculty member in the Art Department there. She later worked on her Masters of Fine Art degree at Utah State University in Logan, Utah. Afterwards, she worked as a graphic art designer and illustrator in Utah and California for several years.

In her early career, JLynn often painted large family portraits, well-

known locales such as Chinatown, and large, detailed depictions of wildlife. But JLynn's personal style changed over the years. She soon moved on from watercolor to acrylics and created many non-objective paintings using colored dots to represent movement through space. She was also a master at taking everyday trash and making art with it. The unique drapery in her studio, made from an assortment of product labels and images, is a testament to this ability. As her health deteriorated in more recent years, she painted daily internet landscapes from around the world and shared them with our local community.

JLynn was the consummate teacher of the basics of art, no matter the media. In order to share her knowledge of art with others, she established a studio near her Melrose home where she held beginning and intermediate classes in printing, acrylic, and watercolor.

During her time serving on the board of the Umpqua Valley Arts Association, JLynn was instrumental in the establishment of serious monetary competition in the Umpqua Valley by helping to initiate what is now called the Artworks Northwest Exhibit, an annual juried exhibit which is open to artists from around the entire Pacific Northwest region.

A couple of years ago JLynn gave me a copy of a book titled The Texas Flowerscaper that contains hundreds of her illustrations. Using her skills in illustration, she more recently created a series of personally handmade "books" filled with drawings, paintings, and collages about her life. She always shared these excitedly and encouraged others to use their artistic skills to make their own journals. "Leave a record of your life. Let the future know you lived!" she would say.

This last summer JLynn remained active in Roseburg's local artist community by participating in a WSOsponsored critique group where she imparted her unique insights into good composition and style. Posthumously, she has left behind money for the JLynn Peterson Award which is part of Umpqua Valley Art's annual Artworks Northwest Show.

Anyone who was privileged to know JLynn Peterson has had an opportunity to improve their own life in the world of artistic endeavor.



Fundraising for Artists' Success and Growth

Hello! I'm so pleased and humbled to be serving as the WSO 100 Club President this year. It feels like a really big challenge, but I'm committed to doing my best on behalf of the organization. I truly welcome – and count on – guidance and direction from all of you to help me out.

First, let me thank Suzy Carroll for all the excellent things she and the WSO 100 Club Board accomplished in 2022. Perhaps the biggest achievement was completing a many months-long strategic planning initiative. From the work that was done in those sessions, the WSO 100 Club reaffirmed our Purpose, and solidified our Charter as the "foundational fundraising organization for WSO" focused on building endowments for artists' awards and education. The strategic planning work also included creating a new organizational chart and updating job descriptions as well as providing direction and initiatives for 2023 and beyond.

With the direction provided by our new strategic plan in mind, I'd like to share with you the 2023 goals and initiatives for WSO 100 Club.

Fundraising

This year we have two major objectives. First, we will continue our focus on "Fundraising for Artists" (as our banner at the conventions proclaims!), ensuring that we have funds available to support artists' awards at each WSO convention and educational grants to WSO critique groups. We will do this by building our General Funds cash reserve year after year as a buffer between fundraising events. In addition, the General Funds may also be the source for developing and funding potential new programs, such as scholarships.

Second, we will also work to expand our donor base, beyond WSO membership, to include the greater art communities in Oregon and nationally, with art product suppliers, galleries, art education organizations and others.

As we develop a broader and more public donor base, it becomes more and more important to provide documentation of the relationship between WSO 100 Club and

Painting animals is similar to painting people — eyes, noses, ears, and mouths — but with a focus on fur. In some ways capturing the fur is one of the most challenging aspects of painting our wonderful friends. Often it ends up looking "spikey" when we paint it in watercolor. This past fall, I learned the secret of painting soft fur from AWS, NWS artist Kathleen Giles which I will pass on to you. Once again, we'll study and paint eyes. Eyes capture the soul of people and animals. Bring your brushes, watercolors, and some small sheets





of paper to practice the techniques I will show you. If you wish, bring a drawing of a special animal or pet, and try practicing what you've learned.



Vera will demonstrate how to construct a strong, connected composition and how to break many of the "rules" of art and take chances, which make your art memorable and personal. Other work will include direct stenciling as a way to repeat patterns. Whether you are a beginner or an experienced artist, you will benefit from this hands-on workshop, gaining a new perspective on how to build and design a better painting.
