President's Message

Becky Meier, WSO President

Greetings!

I hope you're enjoying a fun and relaxing summer. I'm looking forward to seeing you at the convention this October! I wanted to share a couple of important updates with you.

Update on PayPal and Credit Card Transaction Fees – As part of our ongoing efforts to reduce costs, WSO will no longer be able to absorb all credit card processing

fees for exhibit, convention, and workshop registrations. While we've previously covered these fees for member convenience, it's become financially unsustainable.

Here's how the new fee structure works:

- PayPal charges a fee of 3.49% + \$0.49 per transaction
- Constant Contact adds a separate 2.9% fee per order

WSO will continue to absorb the PayPal fee (the larger portion), but members who choose to pay by credit card will now be responsible for the 2.9% Constant Contact fee. If you pay with a credit card or via PayPal, the applicable fees will be clearly noted at checkout.

Tip: You can always pay by check to avoid any extra fees.

Workshop Refund Policy Reminder – As a reminder, our bylaws state:

Policy II.D.2.c. "Members MUST cancel at least 14 days before a workshop to receive a refund. Cancellations made after this period will only be refunded if the spot can be filled by another participant. In both cases, a \$25 processing fee will be retained."

Please note that we do **not** offer refunds for cancellations made *during* the workshop, even in

the case of illness or injury. The convention's budget is based on a full workshop, so we appreciate your understanding.

I hope you're still finding time to keep your brush wet amid the summer distractions. Looking forward to reconnecting in October!



Education Grants - More Options, Easier to Navigate! Barb Hutchings, WSO 100 Club President

You may know that the WSO 100 Club directs our fundraising towards two separate goals: 1) funding the artist awards at our bi-annual exhibitions and 2) providing education grants to WSO artists. To focus on education grants, the program

guidelines have recently been updated, with more options and easier procedures to follow. Please take advantage of this opportunity to take part in WSO education grants!

Highlights of the education grant program:

- Up to \$500 is available per grant awarded
- Number of grants in any given year will depend on the 100 Club's budget for the year
- Grant money must be used for educational activities with at least two WSO members (non-WSO artists are welcome to participate)
- Activities eligible for grants have been expanded and include
 - In-person workshops with live instruction
 - Online workshops with live instruction
 - Recorded workshops/demos with self-facilitation
 - Field trips to view exhibits, galleries, or artist studios with a resident "docent" leading
- Grant money can be used for instructor fees, space or equipment rental, travel, or lodging, admission fees, etc.
- Applications are accepted anytime and funded on a first-come/firstserved basis
- Applications will be reviewed by the WSO 100 Club Education Director
- A simple report is due at the end of the activity, using a template provided



Convention registration opens Saturday, August 16, at 8:00 am and closes Saturday, September 6, at 8:00 pm. You will be able to register for all convention events and can access wait lists using the link that will be emailed to you on the morning of August 16. After verifying your selections online, you may pay via credit card, PayPal or mail in a check. Use the information provided on your confirmation sheet (which is emailed to you immediately after registration) for instructions on where to send your check payment.

You will be sent an email reminder about registration approximately one week prior to the opening of convention registration (prior to August 16th). A second email reminder will be sent on the morning registration begins - that email will have the link to register for the convention. Alternatively, you may register from the WSO website when convention registration opens to the public on August 16.

Remember to print your itinerary at home and bring it with you to the convention, as there will be no printed itineraries at the venue.

As stated by President Becky Meier elsewhere in this Watermark, page 3, as part of our ongoing efforts to reduce costs, WSO will no longer be able to absorb all credit card processing fees for exhibit, convention, and workshop registrations. While we've previously covered these fees for member convenience, it's become financially unsustainable.

Here's how the new fee structure works:

PayPal charges a fee of 3.49% + \$0.49 per transaction; Constant Contact adds a separate 2.9% fee per order. WSO will continue to absorb the PayPal fee (the larger portion), but members who choose to pay by credit card will now be responsible for the 2.9% Constant Contact fee. Tip: You can always pay by check to avoid any extra fees. If you pay with a credit card or via your PayPal account, the applicable fees will be clearly noted at checkout.

Convention Refunds: Per WSO policy, refunds are made only if a reservation is canceled within five days after the close of online registration, or in the event of serious illness, accident, or death in the family. All refunds, less a \$5.00 processing fee, will be mailed or refunded after the convention ends according to the original method of payment. The deadline to request a "no fault" refund for the 2025 Fall Convention is on or before September 11, 2025.





There are numerous ways to begin abstractly, but Jeannine has found using thin Manila board and blue painter's tape can produce exciting results. Marianne Nelson — Painting Realistic Animal Eyes, \$15

Have you ever worked on a painting of an animal and struggled getting their eyes to come to life? Then this is the workshop for you. Marianne has many years of experience in painting realistic animals as well as teaching others her techniques. 
