Our setting in the mid-Willamette Valley is rich with historical landmarks, the meandering Willamette River, hillside vineyards, and an island nature park on the edge of the city. Your Salem 2018 Fall Convention Tri-Chairs are excited to show you what our area has to offer and welcome you to a fabulous weekend of art as well as other adventures.

Whatever your interests may be, there is a lot to see and do in Oregon's sparkling capital city. The domed Oregon State Capitol building is set amid a park with gardens. RESTATEMENT OF WSO ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION: A JOURNEY

The journey to determine WSO's status with the IRS has taken more than a year since



Our attorney David Atkin has determined that the newly written Revenue Procedure 2018-15 allows an organization that received nonprofit status when it was unincorporated to retain its tax-exempt status as stated in its original determination letter (1977 for WSO). This is true even for organizations that received their original determination letter and were subsequently incorporated before Revenue Procedure 2018-15 was issued if the "character, purposes, or methods or operation" have remained the same, as is the case for the Watercolor Society of Oregon, which was incorporated in 1995.

Attorney David Atkin wrote Nonprofit Restated Articles of Incorporation of Watercolor Society of Oregon, which the WSO Board voted unanimously to adopt on July 5, 2018. President Beth Verheyden signed the document, which Attorney Atkin's office has filed with the Corporate Division of the Secretary of State, Oregon. Upon approval by the Secretary of State, we will inform the IRS that Oregon's Secretary of State has approved WSO's Restated Articles of Incorporation.

This nonprofit, status journey is close to being over, and it has been my honor to pursue it from the beginning and to finalize it with the IRS and with publication in WSO's 2019 Membership Roster & Handbook.

SPRING 2018 MENUCHA BY DESIGN WORKSHOP WITH BETH VERHEYDEN

In preparation for the workshop, Beth asked the 20 participants to read *Learn Watercolor the Edgar Whitney Way*. It was written by Ron Ranson, who Beth credits as one of her most influential teachers.

In the four-day workshop, Beth covered each of the elements and principles of design thoroughly. She emphasized the importance of making choices on dominance. *"Will my shapes be predominantly geometric or organic; will a majority of my values be dark or light; will my colors be mostly warm or cool?"* Throughout her presentation Beth stressed, *"Dominance quiets the chaos that happens without it."*

Beth also emphasized composition as *"the bones of any* painting." Beth does a lot of planning and problem solving in her sketchbook before she ever starts a painting. When working from reference photos, she reminded us that a photo is only a starting point, an inspiration. She asked us to identify the areas in our photos which most expressed what we wanted to say. She challenged us to use solid design principles to cut out unnecessary details in the photo and create a painting which communicated our message simply and clearly.

And it wouldn't be a Verheyden workshop without color mixing exercises! We mixed a huge variety of secondary and neutral colors just using the three primary colors.

The most important gifts of the workshop were the undivided attention and positive feedback Beth gave to each student as she moved around the room.

A few comments from workshop participants underscore Beth's enthusiasm for design and the insights and encouragement her students received from her to achieve their artistic goals:

"Beth stretches your artistic mind in every direction."

"Beth [has] an amazing knack for organizing [the elements and principles

of] design in a pragmatic way" ~ "into a manageable step-by-step process" ~ "in such a way that I could ask myself significant questions that helped me to express myself."

"As a beginner, this [workshop] was extremely challenging. I have always copied what the instructor demonstrated. Beth made me think, plan my design, [and] make decisions for my own artistic vein."

"This is the first time I've been eager to do a preparatory value study. This workshop will...revolutionize how I go about my painting."

"[Beth] is very effective one on one, giving exactly what is needed...for a student. She delights in their progress."

"I enjoyed the way she supported and encouraged each participant at this workshop."

One more comment recaps why Menucha is such a great place to take a workshop:

"Menucha is all the good parts of Summer Camp! Arts, nature, [wonderful food], conversation circles, snacks, late night giggles, and friendships to be continued."

Pouring: Making Luminous Watercolors by Layered Masking with Jenny Armitage \$15

9:00 – 10:30 am Salem Convention Center, 2nd Floor, Croisan Room C

Pouring watercolors is a method that builds up layers of washes while using masking to preserve key portions of each layer. Results are often luminous and may look similar to lithographs or silk-screened work. In this lecture and demo session, Jenny will show you how to use photo editing software to create cartoons and value sketches necessary to plan a poured painting. She will take you step by step through the process and demonstrate the pouring process. Bring a pencil and paper for notes and the desire to try a new method. Jenny was born in 1962 to an artistic couple. She rebelled by going to law school. In her 40's she conformed by teaching herself to sculpt, then to draw and paint. Her watercolors hang at Art in the Valley (Corvallis), and she participates in art fairs. No one hangs her briefs anywhere.
