REGISTRATION FOR THE 2017 SPRING CONVENTION

The WSO Board has voted to make electronic registration the standard for all WSO conventions. Each event, unless free, will be individually priced; and you may select as many or as few of the items as you wish when you register.

For the 2017 Spring Convention we will again use a one-page registration form that will include all registrant information for you and your guest(s) as well as your selection of convention events. You will be asked to register for free events as well as those with an attached cost to ensure that event space and seating is adequate for all who wish to attend each event. A summary of the events you select will appear on your registration page along with individual events and/or meal descriptions, prices, and your total. After verifying your selections, payment by credit card can then be made through PayPal (no PayPal account necessary), or you may opt to pay by check using the information provided.

The 2017 Roster includes the 33 new members of the Class of 2016. We welcome and congratulate you and look forward to your energy and new ideas. In April 2016, we celebrated our 50th Anniversary and History. As a part of that history, in 1995, WSO applied for IRS 501(c)(3) status but was unsuccessful. The IRS has designated WSO as a Social Club with 501(c)(7) tax-exempt status. Since WSO members directly benefit from exhibitions and sale of their art, monetary donations to WSO by individuals are not tax deductible. Donations by businesses may be deductible as promotional. Check with your tax preparer.

The WSO100 Club, on the other hand, was determined to be a 501(c)(3) and is eligible to receive tax-deductible donations. The interest that is generated within the WSO100 Club Foundation supplements show awards for artists at WSO Spring and Fall Awards Banquets. The WSO100 Club will provide, in part, monies for the awards to the artists at the up-coming joint exhibitions for the Western Federation of Watercolor Societies and Watercolor Society of Oregon at The Jordan Schnitzer Museum of Art in Eugene.

Please note that we are making additions and corrections in our publications and website to clarify our IRS status.

Watercolor Society of Oregon is a membership organization, which means it is member directed, board guided. Members have voting power. Your attendance is crucial at Membership Meetings, which are held two times a year at the Sunday morning business meeting at each convention, just before the juror demonstration.

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SNOW STORM CANCELS 2017 JANUARY BOARD MEETING

Convention Registration in the News & Events menu. Online registration will open on Wednesday, February 15, 2017 at 8:00 am and will close on Wednesday, March 15, 2017 at 8:00 pm. Registration will not be available prior to February 15, 2017.

After the one-month registration period, on-line registration will close; you will need to register for additional events or meal choices at the Hospitality Table at the convention.

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
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By Geoff McCormack The 100 Club has been busy transitioning to new management. On October 8 it

installed a new Board of Directors (BOD). The new BOD met on October 29 in Salem for a study session to plan our goals, review bylaws, and start recruitment for a qualified Treasurer.

On November 26 the BOD met in Portland and took action; we installed WSO member Jean Lea as Treasurer. Jean has worked for years in business finance. She is the BOD's liaison to the 100Club Endowment Fund. Welcome Jean.

We also authorized Rand Dawson to act as Interim Custodian of the 100 Club Endowment Fund. Rand has created and delivered the necessary documents for our transition. He has been a great help with the transition while Jean Lea and I come up to speed. Thanks Rand. We appreciate your assistance.

The 100 Club's BOD met again on December 7 via email. The Board adopted a resolution regarding an appointment of new "Authorized Individual(s)" (AI), "to act on the behalf of the 100 Club as to all Charles Schwab & Co. accounts and funds therein." This resolution keeps Chris Keylock Williams and Michael Patterson of Mengis Capital Management as AIs and adds Rand Dawson as an AI. It also revokes all other unnamed AIs.

The 100 Club, Inc. will continue to be the source of our exhibition awards. Since its establishment in 1984, the Endowment Fund has enabled WSO to honor its exhibition award winners with some-

thing more than a ribbon. For over 30 years, Jim Williams, husband of 100 Club founder Chris Keylock Williams, expertly managed the fund. The Endowment Fund has continually grown in value and will continue to preserve Education and Award monies into the future.

At the 2016 Fall Convention in Oregon City, the 100 Club gave \$2,500 towards total awards. You may wonder where this money comes from. The answer is the 100 Club's Endowment Fund. The Endowment Fund consists of two distinct funds: the Education Fund and the Awards Fund. The money in the Education Fund is funded by WSO and a few other sources.

The money in the Awards Fund is provided by \$100 donations from fellow WSO artists and other benefactors. Only the interest earned in the Awards Fund is used for awards, leaving the principal intact.

Contribute only \$100, and you will become a 100 Club Patron for life! You will be recognized at all of our shows, and your name will be listed in the catalogue. If you are already a patron, consider donating again in the name of a loved one, an influential art teacher, or favorite artist. Think of your name as a patron next to patron artists such as Wyeth or Picasso. Now that's gettin' close to immortality and for only \$100! Please join us! Fill out the online donation form for yourself or Winslow Homer (my favorite watercolorist) and send it in.

DYNAMIC PORTRAITS WITH THE DUO - CHRIS STUBBS AND RENE EISENBART

Chris and Rene introduced fun, energy, and excitement, as well as excellent instruction into their portrait workshop held October 30-November 3, 2016 at the Menucha Retreat and Conference Center; we had four days without a boring minute and never enough time! On the first day we learned how the eye's placement, shape, and shading dictate expression for a painting. Then we practiced how to make skin tones and putting in shadows for the best effect. Cropping was another important lesson; we learned the difference between cropping for a portrait sale or for a juried show. I didn't realize how intense a painting could become if it was tightly cropped.

As the workshop progressed we expanded on what we were learning: the nose and mouth, eyebrows and hair, even wrinkles; again the cropping; and painting large, really large. Although strange at first, it truly is easier to paint a large face rather than a small one. Drawing was encouraged to learn shapes before we painted them; backgrounds and design were discussed; and how to keep the viewer "in the painting". We experimented with different papers and different coatings on the paper, pouring, dripping, and color mixing. The daytime working hours were a balanced combination of lecture/instruction with time to practice what we were learning. Some students were still painting at 9:00 pm!

To me, one of the very best treats was the seemingly unlimited attention that Chris and Rene gave to us individually. All day and every evening, they were never off duty, always willing to give us help no matter how large or small the

problem. Rene and Chris also shared their paintings, prints, and electronic photos of their work. Each had a painting in the WSO 2016 Fall show. They are wonderful artists, but even better for us, excellent teachers.

And an added pleasure was the quaint and historical, yet comfortable Menucha accommodations with space to paint, eat, and sleep all in one building; such luxury to be able to leave your project on the table and walk into another room to enjoy a delightful meal three times a day!

2017 is an exciting year for Menucha and WSO. In the spring, instructor Harold Walkup is coming to Menucha May 7-10. After spending a year in Spain, Harold is eager to bring his inspiration and expertise to you in a 3-day workshop "Color and Design with Purpose."

Harold has been teaching for many years at the Oregon Society of Artists in Portland and has signature membership in the National Watercolor Society, Northwest Watercolor Society, and Western Federation of Watercolor Societies. He has won numerous awards both regionally and nationally, and his work has been published in *Splash 4* as well as *Best of Watercolor II* and other books and magazines. In addition, in 2014 he won the Gold Medal in the *Interna-*

tional Artist Magazine's competition with his painting Full Circle.



TRANSPORT THE TRAVELING SHOW

Think of being able to linger and appreciate parts of our gorgeous state while at the same

time helping WSO reduce expenses. It simply involves driving to one of the Traveling Show galleries and taking the Traveling Show to the next gallery. For instance the Infusion Gallery in Troutdale is currently hosting the 2016 Fall Traveling Show. You could see magnificent, rushing waterfalls along the Columbia Gorge Highway before taking the paintings to Albany at the beginning of March. And if vou are a lover of historic homes, Albany has more than 700 historic buildings dating from 1840's to the 1920's.

If you live near a hosting gallery or want to explore the area, please consider picking up the Traveling Show and taking it to the next venue. Each time someone does this it will save WSO from \$500-\$800 or more depending on the distance involved. Check the Traveling Show schedule in the February issue of the

Watermark to see the list of future galleries.

The host gallery will pack up each show; all that is necessary for a volunteer to do is to load the crates in their vehicle, which most galleries will help with, and drive to the next location. The four crates are large, 44-inches high, 45-inches long, and 14-inches wide. Your vehicle must be large enough to handle those dimensions. A minivan or larger vehicle will work. Pickup trucks are also ok since the cases are waterproof.

We particularly thank Rob Robinson, Kara Pilcher, and Sharon Rackham King for volunteering their time in transporting crates. They have saved WSO over six thousand dollars.

The board has voted to reimburse drivers at the IRS Mileage Rate, which currently is 54 cents per mile.
