Gordon House Tour

On Saturday WSO
Members had the
opportunity to tour the
only Frank Lloyd Wright
designed building in
Oregon. In 1956 Conrad
and Evelyn Gordon
commissioned Frank
Lloyd Wright to design a
home for them along the
banks of the Willamette
River. It was finished in
1964 and Mr. and Mrs.

Gordon lived there for the rest of their lives.

Mr. Wright designed the Gordon House in line with the idea that the location of a home dictated how a house should look. The Gordon House is also one of Frank Lloyd Wright's Usonian homes, which were designed for families with modest income. The house is constructed of cedar and painted cinder blocks with cut out window

lattice detail. Most of the rooms are small and functional. However the living and dining areas are spacious with twelve-foot floor-to-ceiling windows.

The Gordon property was eventually sold, and the new owners agreed to donate the house to the Frank Lloyd Wright Building Conservancy, a charitable organization whose mission is to preserve Wright's building legacy.



Concerts are given quite often at the Gordon House.

The house was deconstructed in 2001 and moved to the Oregon Garden from its original site in Wilsonville. It opened to the public in March 2002.





Critique #1 with Kathleen Convover

She added a new twist to the program. She invited Members whose paintings she critiqued to ask questions concerning what she had said.

Critique # 2

Eighteen WSO Members submitted their work for scrutiny during Kathleen Conover's afternoon critique session. Here are some of the important highlights that our amazing Juror noted for more successful paintings and fewer rejections:

"Be aware of what your goal is in your painting; is it Realism or Abstraction? Have a sense of mystery in your paintings. Watch the negative spaces, organic grids, and composition. Think shape, value, line, and motion. Simplify and vary your shapes and have interesting negative shapes. Be careful of shapes that point the viewer out of the painting. Z and F shapes work well in landscape design. Watch your drawing skills,

particularly when it comes to portraiture. Make darks even darker than you think. Remember your light source. Watch for fragmented designs; darks can hold them together. Distribution of color is important. Abstract paintings sometimes need to be chopped and shapes allowed to come off the edge of the paper. Bring together an abstract painting that is inspired by water using lines, shape, and mass. Calm a background that is too busy or bold with a glaze over it; gray is the best color to use if you cannot decide what to use. When painting something like flowers, the first background wash should include all the colors in your painting. And when using texture in your work, watch your value differences."

We thank our Juror, Kathleen Conover, for taking the time and effort to offer so much helpful advice to improve our paintings for acceptance into future shows.





and one's heart on the same piece of paper is a PAINTING," is the quote Judy gave each artist who attended her session. We certainly saw excellent examples of how Judy expresses what is in her head, her eyes, and in her heart. Each of her paintings is an example of her ongoing creative genius. How does she do it? She designs each piece so that it captures and holds the viewer's attention.

Chalkboard paint is one of the new materials Judy demonstrated for us. She applied it with a sponge roller over an area she wanted to "re-create." Then she dipped alphabet letter stamps into chalkboard paint to print words. After stamping words, Judy dipped a small flat brush into white matte acrylic latex. Using

calligraphy, she then painted white lettering onto the black chalkboard paint. The participants watched closely as Judy demonstrated how to have fun with FRESH painting techniques that she has incorporated into her recent paintings. Sally Bills Bailey Bold Color Bold Shapes

An eager participant in Sally Bills Bailey's workshop **Bold Color** Bold Shapes, remarked, "I'm going to start using bigger brushes and bigger pieces of paper!" Class participants watched in awe as Sally confidently demonstrated her approach to painting with "lots of paint, not much water." Her rich saturated style of painting creates colorful dynamic landscapes. She revealed that using large tubes of Cheap Joe's watercolor paints and "Skipper Brushes," created by Skip Lawrence, are the secrets to spreading around large swaths of color on to a large sheet of paper.

Sally demonstrated her approach using a reference landscape photo; she quickly sketched in her design with yellow paint and then dove into her pallet with the skipper brushes to apply saturated color to the paper. As the workshop participants tried

their hand at this BOLD approach, it meant taking a leap of faith that one could use more paint, less water, and a bigger brush, and still get exciting results. But this approach translated into colorful and dynamic workshop paintings.

I discovered that most of the QoR watercolors are rated 1, with a few 2's in light/color-fastness and the Aquasol binder is clearer than the usual yellow gum arabic in watercolors, is a better adhesive, and is easier to layer and build up. And if you prepare your surface with GOLDEN's Lift Aid, even the staining colors naturally lift well.



acrylic, and dry media. After attending art school in Palermo, Italy, where he was born, Francesco continued his education studying with Italian Masters. Later he followed his bohemian dream and began his artistic journey in the streets of Paris drawing tourists' portraits. In the years that followed, he exhibited his art in multiple venues in Italy and France, and now his paintings are in many private collections in Europe, USA, and Asia.

In 2008 Francesco co-founded Fare Pittura Atelier, based in Milan, Italy. He is the director and also teaches classes in life drawing, oil, and watercolor. He alternates his teaching schedule in Milan with intensive travel as a workshop instructor and presenter. He has taught dozens of workshops through out France and Italy and has been invited to teach as far away as Bali, Indonesia, and the United States.


