IN MEMORIAM

Memorial to Charlene Robinson

WSO member Charlene Robinson passed away at 94 years old after a long battle with lymphoma on June 13, 2015. Charlene had been a member of the Oregon Watercolor Society since 1983. Charlene's artwork has been exhibited in national and international shows. She was very excited when her artwork was accepted into a show in China. Her work has been juried into the Audubon Society in New York City and the Smithsonian Museum Gallery in Washington D.C., as well as Ducks Unlimited.

Besides being a watercolor artist, Charlene was also an accomplished printmaker. Her prints are in several important collections around the country. She also worked in encaustics and mixed media. She loved art in all its forms. Charlene was a member of the Broderick Gallery in Portland, as well as a member of the NW Print Council, Print Arts NW, Painters Showcase, Oregon Society of Artists, and Paint and Palette. She also has work in the permanent Ray Trayle Collection in the Haley Ford Gallery at Willamette University. She was proud to have helped write a book about the late Ray Trayle who was a master builder of fine art etching presses.

Charlene grew up in Kansas City, Missouri and moved to Oregon when she was in high school. She graduated from Jefferson High School in 1938 and married James Wilson who had attended school with her in Missouri and had followed her out to Oregon. He joined the Army and on a three-day leave, which he took against orders, they got married in 1941. He shipped out, and they didn't see one another until he returned four years later. Unfortunately, their marriage did not survive the adversity of his PTSD and the changes the war wrought upon their relationship.

During this difficult time, Charlene's son Gerald Wilson says that his earliest memories are of her passion for art. He would wake to the smell of oil paint. In order to provide a space to paint Charlene hung a blanket to divide the room she shared with him at her parents' home.

Later she married Ted Robinson. Many years later he had a stroke and was hospitalized at the VA Hospital in Vancouver, WA. Every day Charlene drove from Hillsboro to visit him until he passed away five years later.

Charlene had a wonderful sense of humor. She once dressed up as a waitress and sang the song, "Be Happy," as she skipped around the room serving soup to people at a church dinner. She volunteered as secretary for several years at Singing Hills Christian Church, in Hillsboro. She also loved traveling to Europe to take art classes as well as going to the beach to relax and take photos for future art projects. She loved people as well as she loved art.

Knowing she was moving to an assisted living apartment, Charlene sold her beloved Trayle printing press to Portland University. She was excited to be asked to give a workshop on printmaking using her press at the age of 93. She was thrilled after the workshop, when she was told that the printmaking classes were filled with waiting lists.

Charlene was "a lady's lady" as one of her longtime friends remarked. She had many interests and many friends. She will be missed.



REGISTRATION FOR THE 2016 SPRING CONVENTION

In an effort to keep online registration for WSO conventions as simple as possible, for the 2016 Spring Convention we will again use a one-page registration form that will include all registrant information for you and your guest (if you have one) and the selection of convention events. A summary of events, which you have selected, will appear on your registration page along with prices and your total. After verifying your selections, payment by credit card can then be made through PayPal (no PayPal account necessary) or you may opt to pay by check using the information provided.

After a successful trial of ala carte selection for the 2015 Spring Newport Convention and subsequent use at the 2015 Fall Hermiston Convention, the WSO Board has voted to make it the standard for future conventions. Each event, unless free, will be individually priced, and you may select as many or as few of the items as you wish.

- Development of intuitive and abstract subject matter with fluid acrylics and/or watercolor.



- The deadline date is for **all parts** of the entry requirements.
- When the mat requirement calls for a minimum of 3.5 inches, you must add 7 inches to your image size. (There are 2 sides to your mat in each direction.)
- All WFWS exhibitions require outer mat measurements to be in even numbers.






#2 Oregon Garden Paint Out with Leslie Cheney-Parr (\$15.00)

understanding of painting.

Kathleen has certainly taken our theme of "50 Years and Still *Blooming*" seriously. She continues to grow her career and dig deeper for meaningful content in her work. She holds Signature Status in the American Watercolor Society (Dolphin Fellow), National Watercolor Society, International Society of Experimental Artists, Transparent Watercolor Society of America (Master Artist), and is a Watercolor USA Honor Society Member. Her work has also been featured in numerous publications. Since the article about her was written for the November Water*mark,* she has attended a reception in China and has received an award from the Shenzhen International Watercolor Biennial Exhibition for her painting "Migrations." It is part of her current Industrial Evolution Series. This continuing theme is her interpretation of the era of change that the U.S.A. is undergoing in its technological and manufacturing industries. In "Migration," the folded paper "peace cranes" are symbols for the exchange of ideas around the world that travel far and wide, like the inevitable migration of birds.

Her inspiration and visual references sprout coast to coast, from her iron mining home in Northern Michigan to the Midwest farming heartland and the desert Southwest region. She paints the



not only will it help the library to grow, it will also allow other artists to utilize your collection. You might be replacing a VHS tape as well and saving WSO some money.
