IN MEMORIAM



Memorial to Shirley Mannocci

The many friends of WSO Member Shirley Mannocci will remember her as a joyous, smiling, and courageous woman. Shirley treasured her friendships, some of which began more than 60 years ago. She passed away peacefully at her home on October 26, 2017.

Shirley was born in Nampa, Idaho on April 22, 1938, the oldest of 3 children. She grew up in Ontario, Oregon and in 1956 graduated salutatorian in her Ontario High School class. Shirley married Jack Frost, and together they raised their three children. Later on she worked at the Ontario Daily Argus Observer newspaper as advertising manager.

In 1984 Shirley moved to Salem, OR and worked in advertising at the Statesman Journal. While attending a singles event she met Carlo Mannocci; they were married June 10, 1990. Together they traveled and explored the world, including many trips to Australia and Italy, visiting Carlo's family.

Although Shirley enjoyed many hobbies, for the past 25 years, she has devoted many hours to developing her art. She actually didn't begin painting until she was in her late '60's, having been told that she couldn't draw. But she kept hearing in her head that she should paint flowers; so, following her motto 'Leap and the net will appear!', she began taking watercolor classes. After much instruction and practice, she knew she was a painter. In her paintings she desired to bring "feeling and passion as well as vivid color to the world."

Shirley lived with painful arthritis, but she said, *"For me...art is a way to see beyond my pain and also a vision of what others see in the world."* She wanted others who also live with pain to know, by her example, that creativity is therapy that would allow them to live above the pain and have a rich life.

Shirley was also an accomplished seamstress, sewing her young family's clothing and later developing her own sewing business. She designed many of her own fashions and created beautiful matching dresses for her 3 granddaughters. She also loved outdoor adventures. She was a pilot, enjoyed rafting and the ocean, and also loved Hawaii.

A loving tribute to Shirley was included in "Celebrating the Life of Shirley Rae Mannocci." A portion of it reads: "In the fiery colors of this generous autumn, I find you, I find the poetic brush strokes of your paintings, your sunshine, your warmth. Your beautiful soul has left you with strokes of pencils and brushes, in the images you created while profoundly winning your sufferings. How long you have been in pain, and with how much strength, dignity and patience you knew how to turn it into art! I look at the yellow, red leaves, the sky that now, after weeks, cries a bit, and I remember your amazement in front of the great and small wonders of nature and people's eyes. You saw, dear Shirley, as do the artists, as do great souls, and at the same time you knew how to fly and overfly, always with the smile, with gentleness, with generosity, on the stumbling blocks of life."

Shirley is survived by her devoted husband and best friend, Carlo Mannocci and her three children, Cindy Frost, Marcia Moore, and Steven Frost.

BOARD ACTION

On January 13, the WSO Board met at the Marco Polo Restaurant in Salem. **President Beth**



Verheyden called the meeting to order at 12:19 pm. 11 Board members and 10 committee members were present.

Secretary Amanda James' Board minutes from the October 2017 meeting in Gresham were approved.

President Beth Verheyden welcomed new officers and committee members to the 2017-18 Board. These individuals included Moya Lehman ,Treasurer, Mary Elle, Membership Council, Patrice Cameron, Convention Council, Administrative Council Chair Appointment, Diane York, Caryn Tilton, WSO 100 Club President & Liaison, Beth Schilling, Awards Chair, and Barbara Folawn, Fall 2018 Salem Convention Tri-Chair.

New Business: President Beth Verheyden presented a new policy which had been voted on and passed (7 votes for and 3 votes against) by the Board on October 17, 2017 via email, stating that any selected painting which is subsequently rejected or removed from the exhibition for any reason, shall not be included in the Exhibition Catalog.

Beth announced that WSO has a new Webmaster as well as a Website Liaison. The motion to create the new position of Website Liaison also passed unanimously. **Carol Putnam** will take this position and act as a liaison between WSO Members, Board Members, and the Web Master. She will collect website update requests and communicate them to the Web

Master. Beth presented a new Request for Website Updates form which is available on our website.

President Beth Verheyden also presented a motion to include a complete Prospectus in the May and November issues of the *Watermark*, detailing the requirements for the Fall and Spring shows.

Treasurer Moya Lehman presented the Final Report for the Troutdale Convention, which reported a net income of \$1,470. She also presented and discussed the 2017 financial reports, which included the Balance Sheet, Profit and Loss, and detail of the P & L by Council. Moya presented and discussed the pie charts she had prepared, which illustrated income and expenses for the past year. They have been included on page 24 in this issue of Watermark.

Old Business: Kathryn Damon-Dawson met with an attorney in October 2017 to review the status of the WSO IRS 501(c)(7) in an effort to bring our current Bylaws in compliance with our IRS status. The attorney is representing WSO to IRS, and **KDD** will continue to follow up with this matter. New Business: Patrice Cameron presented a motion regarding the use of Preauthorized Return Shipping Labels on the return of exhibition paintings; it was carried unanimously.

Convention Committee Reports: Spring 2018 Florence: Chair Kathryn Damon-Dawson informed the Board that all Convention events and most volunteers are in place. There is the possibility of a garage sale; all sales will go toward the WSO general fund. There are 6 spaces left in the workshop. All 8 Old Town Galleries remain committed for the Friday Meet & Greet. The Friday Night Dinner Out has been arranged with WSO Board Members as hosts. Logo Merchandise Co-Chairs Sharon Hansen and Nan Newell are unable to attend the Convention and the Logo Merchandise Table is in need of Members to sell Logo products.

Fall 2018: Barbara Folawn, Tri-Chair with John and Judy Mohney, reported on the progress of the Salem Convention. Contracts with the Salem Convention Center and the workshop facility have been signed. Robbie Laird has contracted with WSO to be our Juror and Workshop Instructor. The Workshop will be held at the new Kroc Center in Salem. Breakout Sessions and instructors have been confirmed. There are two panel discussions for which speakers and topics remain open. Recommendations are encouraged.

Spring 2019: Moya Lehman has secured a contract with OSA in Portland. The Spring Experimental Exhibition, Artists Reception, and Workshop with Jane Davies will be held at this facility. The Awards Banquet will be held at the World Trade Center in Portland.

Fall 2019 will be held in Bend. **Jennifer Starr, Linda Shelton, Linda Burgel, and Dottie Roth** are the Chairs. The Juror will be Joyce Hicks.

Spring 2020 will have Michael Reardon as Juror. A Convention Chair and location are still needed. Grants Pass has expressed some interest.

Fall 2020 will have Kristi Grussendorf as Juror. A Convention Chair and location are still needed.

Exhibition Locations Chair Zsuzsanna Vamos has secured all locations for the Traveling Show through 2018. Verbal agreements are in place for part of 2019.

Exhibition Shipping Chair Sandra Wood and Zsuzsanna Vamos have decided to use cardboard boxes with foam board separators to transport the Award Winning paintings. The crates will require one large SUV or two smaller ones. We may elect to rent a van or truck to move all paintings together. Mileage will be reimbursed. Please contact Sandra, if you would like to volunteer.

On Line Entry: Suzi Blaisdell reported that entries ran more smoothly for the 2017 Fall Convention. **Show Juror Liason: Jennie Chen** reported that there were no outstanding problems during the 2017 Fall Watercolor Exhibition.

President Beth Verheyden reported that the Hospitality Team of **Susan Lyslo, Bobbie Matthews, Kathie McEvers, Rose West, and Dona White** is operating successfully and will serve for two years or four conventions.

Vice President/Public **Relations Council Chris Stubbs** informed us of her recommendations for Jurors for the Spring and Fall Conventions of 2021. For the Fall Watercolor Exhibition, Chris suggested either Tom Schaller or Iain Stewart, both of whom are long standing teachers and immensely qualified. They are plein air painters. Cityscapes are their specialties. For the Spring 2021 Convention, Chris suggested Ken and Stephanie Goldman. She has taken workshops from Ken Goldman and recommended him highly. As Chris explained, "Ken's gift is to help the student learn how to draw and paint the figure from a model." She suggested the possibility of two workshops; Ken could teach a 5-day workshop and Stephanie a 3-day. Her other suggestions included Jean Pederson, a Canadian figurative painter, Ken Call, and Linda Kemp, a Canadian painter who specializes in negative painting. All of these artists have published books and articles.

Administrative Council (Retiring Chair) Tupper Malone introduced the new Breakout Session Evaluation Form, which will be made available at each Breakout Session and the Hospitality Table starting at the Florence Convention. **Publication Council Chair Paul Bourgault** reported that the complete versions of the Prospectus would be included in May and November issues of the *Watermark*.

Pat Farr, our new Video Librarian, brought the entire collection of 155 WSO videos for the Board to peruse.

Membership Council Mary Elle reported that as of January 13, 2018, the total membership is 724; this is a decrease of 45 compared to 2017. There are 79 active Members still owing 2018 dues.

Awards Chair Beth Schilling submitted a WSO Awards Report. Solicitation letters have been sent to critique groups as well as businesses and individuals. Donations are due March 15, 2018. She has also secured other donations and is in the process of obtaining more. Beth continues to work with the WSO 100 Club to procure available Award funds.

Merit Awards: Becky Meier thanked Liz Walker for updating the list on the website of Members who have achieved Merit Awards at the various levels. Becky is working on updating the forms used to submit information for Members who acquire the initial 10 points.

WSO 100 Club President & Liaison, Caryn Tilton presented the WSO 100 Club Treasurer's Report. The funds total \$191,684.32. In addition, Caryn presented the WSO 100 Club Board Report. During discussion the Board requested that the new \$30 hanging fee be turned over in its entirety to the WSO general fund.

The Meeting was adjourned at 3:02 pm.

I have been updating our Critique Group Roster; hopefully in the near future it will be correct, for a short

time anyway. I am finding it is somewhat of a moving target. My thanks to all of the WSO Members who have continued to send me updates on critique groups.

The Oregon Coastal areas are still working on forming critique groups. I know it is an area that is challenging because of the distances and traffic on 101. Let me know if you are interested in creating a critique group at the coast, and I will work with you.

If you haven't joined the Watercolor Society of Oregon's Facebook page, you are missing some essential communications.

I want to remind the critique groups that any group is eligible to receive one grant per year to hold a workshop for your group. The information and forms for a workshop are on the website under the tab "About." Click on "Forms" and then click on "Workshop Request Forms."

WSO Guidelines for a Critique Group Workshop:

- WSO will provide up to 50% of the cost, up to \$500.
- Only one workshop per critique group per year.
- Must have eight participants; with at least 2 WSO Members.
- Must use an approved WSO instructor (see website for list) or get approval from the Education Council.

So far this year we have had one request to hold a workshop from The Curry Arts Group. Their workshop will be in March with René Eisenbart as their instructor. We have funds through the Education Grant to support four different Critique Group Workshops annually. *Margaret Godfrey, Education Council*

REGISTRATION FOR 2018 SPRING CONVENTION

To register for the 2018 Spring Convention, look for an email with a link that goes directly to the online registration system. Registration opens on February 11 at 8:00 am and closes on March 11 at 8:00 pm. You will receive the email prior to the opening date, but registration is not available prior to February 11. Alternatively, you can go to the WSO website and select "Convention Registration" in the News & Events menu.

For the 2018 Spring Convention, your registration form will ask for all registrant information for you and your guest(s) as well as your selection of Convention events. Each event, unless free, is individually priced. You may select as many as you wish when you register. You will be asked to register for free events along with those with a fee so that we can insure that sufficient seating is available for each event. A summary of the events you have selected will appear on your registration page along with prices and your total. This convention will have a buffet dinner so no meal selection is necessary. After verifying your selections, pay by credit card or PayPal (no PayPal account is necessary), or you may opt to send in a check using the instructions provided.

After the one-month registration period, online registration will close. If you want to register for additional events or meals, you will need to do so at the Hospitality Table at the Convention.

Also, please note that refunds are made only if a registration is canceled within five (5) days after the close of online registration or in the event of serious illness, accident, or death in the family. For the Spring Convention, cancellations must be made before 8:00 pm on March 16, 2018.

BOOK REVIEW

Painting Without A Net By Eric Wiegardt

As a compilation of articles written by Eric over the years, the topics and concepts covered in *Painting Without A Net*, challenge the mind to think and plan '*like an artist*' and also encourage the heart to paint with abandon. Deep insight into the human spirit is playfully juxtaposed with bits of humor and history, making my time pure joy as I read in front of the fireplace.

Appropriately so, Eric begins our journey through his book by encouraging us to paint what we love. "Life is too short to drudgingly paint or draw an uninspiring subject for academic reasons." Ah, I feel better already. Happily, I read and turn the pages, gleaning tidbits on the value of value studies and patterns vs. allowing color to get too much glory. As much as I love color, I agree whole-heartedly that 'value does all the work and color gets all the glory.' Now, how to tackle that value plan? Eric's mantra is to keep it simple and concentrate on the pattern of light, middle, and dark values moving through the drawing. "The value study also takes *me away from the tyranny of the* photo," he says. "As artists, we have to constantly fight the seduction of reality. We are called upon to design *independently of our subject."* And he also says that it's ok for the value study to be ugly. He's made me feel good about myself, again.

On design, Eric says, "Regardless of the demands of the subject, design is most important and it determines the final strokes." As a matter of fact, "Design carries the



painting, not the subject." On color harmony, Eric recommends using just three to six colors; the choice of which colors is yours to make. Throughout the book, however, Eric drills this point home, "Color can be anything as long as it is reasonable, but the values must be well organized."

On what's most important – he says, "Have fun! If we're having fun,

we can get up the next day and tackle another painting. We must learn the discipline of painting. With time, our own voice will begin to speak, and we need to pay attention to that."

Painting Without A Net is a book you'll go back to time and again. The chapters are divided by topic, making it easy to find

what you're looking for. Written with truthfulness, bits of humor to lighten the spirit, and history to lend a timeless foundation, this one won't gather dust on the shelf. In April, Eric will be a vendor at the Florence convention, selling and signing his books. I'll be first in line, book in hand for an autograph! I dare you to beat me there.
